## Plans Unveiled for 2019 Plant Operations Workshop/Tour

This year's Plant Operations Workshop and Tour will be held on Thursday, October 17 at the Kishwaukee Water Reclamation District (KWRD) in DeKalb, Illinois. Topics will include an overview of KWRD, focusing on new technology and ongoing plant upgrades, including Bio-P, energy production, and a new UV facility. An update on the continuing education requirements for wastewater operators will be given by the IWEA Operator Training Committee, who will outline how

IWEA is providing opportunities to meet these new requirements. After a catered lunch, participants will be led on a plant tour to see the new processes and equipment highlighted in the morning session.
